## GRANTS AWARDED 2023-2024

DG LINC published a [call for proposals](#) on financial support for training in conference interpreting on 1 March 2023.

DG LINC received **fourteen (14) applications** in response to the call for proposals by the deadline of 11 May 2023. A new topic “Organisation of master, post-graduate courses or bachelor courses by Ukrainian universities with conference interpreting components” was part of the 2023-2024 programme of grants. The applications were submitted to the three topics as follows:

Following the evaluation of the applications under this year’s grant programme<sup>1</sup>, DG LINC signed **Twelve (12) grant agreements** with the following universities:

- Odeskiy Nacionalniy Universitet Imeni i.i. Mechnikova

This is the first time that a European institution finances interpretation training in Ukraine and the first time the European Parliament awards grants to Ukrainian institutions.
